On Saturday, January 24, 1998, the United Tribes Technical College and Theodore Jamerson members of the Howard Hughes Science workshop project (SAGE) hosted a collaborative meeting with the Standing Rock 4-6 grade teachers and the Sitting Bull College site coordinator. SAGE (Science: A Great Edventure) is continuing to strengthen the science curriculum for grades 4-6 in North Dakota schools with high American Indian enrollment. The project continues to have two basic components: teacher enhancement and culturally relevant science curriculum development. Both of these components are designed to involve collaboration of resources locally and across the state.

Theodore Jamerson teachers, Sheri Okland and Terry Moericke, shared information and successes regarding ongoing science activities and projects in their classrooms. Standing Rock grades 4-6 teachers also contributed information as to the many activities and projects that have been happening in their classrooms. Currently the big push is to get the students involved in projects for the local science fair and then the North Dakota State Science Fair.

Others in attendance were Dr. Mark Guy, University of North Dakota SAGE project coordinator; Dr. Guy McDonald, Standing Rock HPRSI coordinator; Kathy Froelich, Sitting Bull SAGE site coordinator; and Carol Anderson, UTTC SAGE site coordinator. The next collaborative meeting is planned for May 9, 1998.

#### I am an alcoholic. I need help.

Don't allow me to lie to you and accept it for the truth, for in so doing, you encourage me to lie. The truth may be painful but get at it.

Don't let me outsmart you. This only teaches me to avoid responsibility and to lose respect for you at the same time.

Don't let me exploit you or take advantage of you. In so doing, you become an accomplice to my evasion of responsibility.


