#### ART SHOW RULES:

- 2. Artwork may be accompanied by a representative from the artist's sponsoring college.
- 3. All entries must have been produced by a living artist within the last two (2) years.
- 4. All entries must arrive at the Radisson Inn no later than 12 noon, April 5, 1998. Entries must remain on exhibit until 5:00 PM on April 7, 1998.
- 5. All entries will be judged by an artist juror. One artist juror for Traditional work and one artist juror for Contemporary work.
