Through its fellowships and Summer Stipends programs, NEH provides opportunities for Individuals to pursue advance work in disciplines of the humanities not limited to the study of the following disciplines: philosophy; languages; linguistics; literature; archaeology; jurisprudence; the history, theory, and criticism of the arts; ethics; comparative religion; and those aspects of the social sciences that employ historical or philosophical approaches.


These two fellowships are on a competitive nature. Faculty members of colleges and universities must be nominated by their institutions and cannot apply directly. Each institution is allowed two applicants. Prospective applicants who will require nomination should acquaint themselves with their institution's nomination procedures.




