\$20,000 in scholarships for Native American journalism students

NAJA program is North American's largest; supported by major media companies

Native American journalism students in the United States and Canada are encouraged to apply before March 31 for more than \$20,000 in college scholarships to be awarded by the Native American Journalists Association (NAJA) this year.

The NAJA Scholarship is North America's largest program for college-bound, undergraduate and graduate Native American journalism students. Supporters include The New York Times, Newhouse News Service, Cox Enterprises, Anheuser-Busch, Newspaper Association of America and Time, Inc. Awards for the 1997-98 school year will be announced at the NAJA annual conference, June 18-21, in Minneapolis.

The NAJA Scholarship Program has awarded more than \$60,000 in scholarships to more than 40 students over the past five years.

Scholarship recipients will:

- Be enrolled members of a state- or Federally-recognized tribe
- Intend to pursue journalism or mass communication studies in college
 - Maintain satisfactory academic standing
 - Apply before the deadline of March 31, 1997
