UTTC Close Out Men's Basketball Season

As many basketball teams turn in their gear, so do the United Tribes Technical College "Thunderbirds," who's season will go down as one of the best in school history. "We had a good season, coming in I expected these guys to perform well and they responded," said 2nd year coach Kevin Finley, "we missed going to the NJCAA National Tournament by one game, that was our goal the first day of pre-season back in September, we just fell 7 points short." It was a season that saw the "Thunderbirds" go from the cellar at the beginning of the season to a contender down the stretch as many teams sometimes over looked United Tribes. "This was really a good group of guys who gave it their all, in the classroom they are solid as they again are all over a 3.0 at mid-term break and that's what's important to me, basketball will end for them sooner or later but their education is what will carry them through life," continued the coach, "athletically they are very talented, if they continue to use basketball as a vehicle through college they will continue to enjoy success at the game they've grown to love." The "Thunderbirds" have one lone sophomore in Terry Lee, "Terry has some really good offers from some NAIA schools and some NCAA Div. 1 schools looked at him so it's not over for him just yet, he gave us 20 points and 11 rebounds per game and replacing him won't be easy, but when you have players like Elvis Old Bull, Lee Logg, Aaron and Eric Abby coming in that makes my job a little easier." The "Thunderbirds" closed out the season as the 1997 AIHEC men's basketball champions with convincing wins over Sitting Bull College, Haskell Indian Nations University and Turtle Mountain Community College in a tournament where Travis Albers and Terry Lee was named to the All-Tourney team and Jason Logg the tournaments Most Valuable Player. "We will return 4 starters in Tanner Albers, Dusty Traversie, Travis Albers and Jason Logg as well as reserves Craig Clown, Todd Thomas, Delvin Wolf and Lonny White Eyes so making this team next year will not be that easy," said coach Finley, "Travis will attend summer school at Harvard University, he is an outstanding young man and may possible forgo his basketball career to further his education in Medicine at Harvard, hopefully we'll get him back but we want what's best for Travis."
