Failure to do so could create a financial burden, plus no transcripts will be sent to other colleges until bills are paid.

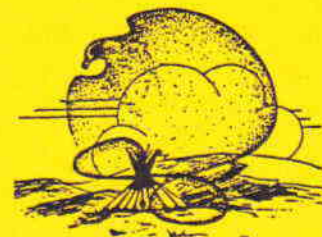
North-Central ITAC II

On October 20-21st, the North-Central Indian Technical Assistance Center at UTTC will be expecting a visit from an official from the Office of Indian Education (OIE) in Washington, DC.

Elizabeth Whitehorn, OIE representative from the U.S. Department of Education, will conduct an assessment of ITAC II administration and services in anticipation of a tentative contract extension. The Center's current contract is slated for expiration on November 30th.

The Center is one of six regional entities established in the U.S. to provide training and technical assistance for education programs serving American Indian and Alaska Native people. The Center's target clientele are approximately 223 schools and organizations supported with Indian Education Act-Title V programs. The ITAC II service region includes the state of Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Nebraska, North and South Dakota, and Wisconsin.

UTTC has served as the prime contractor for the Indian Education Technical Assistance Centers since 1982. The future of the Center is contingent upon congressional reauthorization of the Indian Education Act. Legislative action is anticipated this fall and winter.

Recreation Department

The United Tribes Athletic Department & the Capitol Lanes Bowling Alley are currently working on getting a college bowling league started. This will be a mixed league, consisting of two men and two women on each team. The tentative starting date for this league will be Tuesday, October 19, 1993. Transportation will be provided by the Recreation Department. Free babysitting will be available for all students that are in the league. The Capital Lanes will provide this service.

Colleges that have shown interest in participating in the league are: Standing Rock College of Fort Yates, Bismarck State College and the U. of Mary and United Tribes Technical College. We are asking that only those students and staff that are serious about starting and finishing the league sign up. The reason we stress this is because, in the past bowlers have started the league, but for some reason drop out after two weeks causing their teams to break up and eventually causing the league to suffer and fall apart.

There will be a bowling fee of \$4.50 per week. This amount will have to be paid by each bowler. The college will pay for the students sanction fees. The sanction fees are, \$10.00 for men and \$8.50 for women. If you drop out of the league, the amount of the sanction fee will be taken out of your check for reimbursement. Payroll deductions can be worked out for students bowlers. You must work this out in advance with Mr. Ray Dwelle at the Financial Aids Office.

Sanctioned bowlers will be eligible to bowl in the All Indian BIA Bowling Tournament to be held the month of January in Bismarck, ND.
