
Athletic Department

The Thunderbird basketball season is well on it's way for the 1994-1995. The 2nd annual Thunderbird basketball classic was another success this year held on November 17, 18, & 19, 1994. The teams that participated in this year's classic were Jamestown College Junior Varsity, Haskell Indian Nations University from Lawrence, Kansas, Bismarck State College and your United Tribes Technical College.

Bismarck State College finished with 2 wins and no losses. Haskell Indian Nations University finished with a record of 2 wins and 1 loss. Jamestown College J.V. finished with a record of 1 win and 1 loss. The Thunderbirds finished with a record of 0 wins and 3 losses.

The Thunderbirds leading scorer is Curtis Bad Bear with a average of 26.0 points per game. The leading rebounder is Bernard Strikes Enemy with a average of 8.4 rebound sper game. Corwin Black Smith is leading the team in assists with a 4.8 average per game. Dave Jackson is leading the way from the Free Throw line with a 78% clip. Marvin Aragon is leading in 3 point shooting with 67%. Bernard Strikes Enemy is shooting an astounding 63% from the floor.

The Recreation Department has on hand for check out, the New YMCA cards. Only staff and students are allowed to check these ards out. If you are not employed or a student at United Tribes you will not be allowed to check these cards out. You will be required to show proper I.D. before we release the cards to you. There is a 24 hour maximum that you are allowed to have the cards checked out. If you do not check the cards in at the specified time, you will be charged a \$5.00 penalty, failure to pay the penalty will result in a suspension of YMCA card privileges. If you lose a card or fail to return it, the full purchase will be deducted from your pay check.

Recreation will provide transportation to the YMCA for the students on the following days; Monday-6:30 pm-9:00 pm, Wednesday 6:30 pm-9:00 pm, Thursday 6:30 pm-9:00 pm. and Friday 6:30 pm. to 9:00 pm.

Recreation would like to remind the women on campus that the new women's work-out room is open nightly upon request. We have weight machines, bicycles and tread mills. It is located right next to the Recreation Office.

Placement News

Placement services are provided to all UTTC graduates. Although UTTC cannot guarantee employment, every effort is made to place all students into jobs directly related to his/her training. In fulfilling this responsibility the placement staff works closely with the student prior to graduation to determine what types of employment the student is interested in and where the students would like to work.

Upon completion and successful assistance in job placement, the department assists the graduate in securing funds to cover the costs of his/he essential needs, including rent, deposits, food, etc.

Career Development Technician, Shirley Iron Road, will assist students with typing and resume outline.

Placement Officer, Melvin White Eagle is responsible for conducting one on one interview sessions with students. Gathering information from and for students relative to Job Development and Placement.

Jim Davenport, Director of the Placement office at Minot STATE University, says the first thing a student should do once he or she is on campus is visit the Placement Office. "Every campus has one," he says. "While we can't guarantee students a job after graduation, we can help them acquire the skills they'll need to get one."

Davenport emphasizes that placement offices can't help students who don't visit them. "You'd be surprised at the number of students who don't bother us until they are about to graduate," he says. "Although we do everything we can to help them even when they come in late, there is so much we could do to help them before that."

"A misconception needs to be addressed about the role of placement officers," he says. "We don't place students in jobs. Rather, we prepare students for job opportunities by providing resources that will ready them for the interviewing process."

All necessary job development documentations should be in an active file for actual job application and development.

Students who have not completed the required process should do so at this time.

This time period prior to graduation, both the student and career development office will be working directly with potential em-

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ployers and employment agencies. Students should make themselves available for possible job application and actual job interviews.

Career Development materials are available in the Placement Office.

Check the vacancy announcements on display. There may be a job opening just for you. Come and discuss your employment plans with us.

All graduating students are required to complete placement intake and interviews before graduation.

The purpose of the interview will be to make sure that the necessary job development documentations are complete, such as job application forms, resumes, etc.
