John Kauffman, 76, a former employee of United Tribes died on December 7, 1994.

John was born July 18, 1918, near Baker, Montana and grew up in the James River Valley in North Dakota, where his parents farmed. He attended college at the State Normal College in Ellendale and at NDSU. He served in the U.S. Navy during World War II. John taught school and served as a school administrator for 30 years in North Dakota.

He is survived by his wife, Mary, of Bismarck, and two sons and daughters-in-law, one daughter and son-in-law, three grandchildren and one sister.

John taught Math at United Tribes for twelve years. His great wisdom, kindness, and sense of humor will be greatly missed by all of us here at United Tribes who knew him.
