THE POW WOW IS OVER AND THINGS ARE BACK TO NORMAL - The activities were a success and the weather turned out just right. This major activity was a showcase for the United Tribes Technical College, along with the special naming dedication. Along with the local dignitaries there were guests from throughout the nation and from Switzerland and Paris, France.

A "special acknowledgement" goes to all those staff, students and other volunteers who helped make this event an impressive happening.

The **NATIONAL INDIAN EDUCATION ASSOCIATION** will be holding its "19th Annual National Conference" here in **Bismarck**, beginning **October 27-31**. In 1984 United Tribes and the Bismarck-Mandan Convention Bureau visited the NIEA conference when it was held in Phoenix and invited the association to hold its annual meeting here.

Expect some 3,500 visitors here in Bismarck during that time. There will be teachers, school board members, administrators, counselors, high school and college students, tribal officials and host of other American Indian visitors. United Tribes is among the key host organizations to NIEA. The Northern Plains and Woodlands Steering Committee, made up of representatives from North and South Dakota, Montana and Minnesota, is the regional host. Staff members from the United Tribes "Resource and Evaluation Center" have been working with other UT staff to help develop the conference.

The NIEA annual conference has never been held on the "prairies". It is the first time it will be in this region. Let's help make it a success!

Look for some interesting and valuable events during this time. There will be activities for students and staff throughout that week. A wide range and number of workshops will be held at the Kirkwood Motor Inn, the Holiday and the Sheraton Hotels. Student activities will be at the Holiday, with Virgil Hill making a special guest appearance at the NIEA Student Luncheon that week.

Those workshops will be of special interest to staff and faculty. There will be presentations on curricula, counseling, teaching methods, management and cultural activities. More details on these workshops will be upcoming.

Aside from dances, there will be a number of cultural activities--including an "American Indian flute concert". The week will end with an "NIEA Pow Wow" on October 30-31 at the Civic Center.

Teachers and others will want to review the upcoming schedule when it is released. There may be a number of activities which your classes will want to attend.

While there are registration costs for students and for staff to attend this one-time chance to attend the NIEA sessions, United Tribes and the host committee will need a large number of volunteers. For example, registration, ushers, host monitors and information guides will be needed. **Volunteers** will have an opportunity to also take in other activities of the conference. More importantly, it gives you and United Tribes an opportunity to show the best of the school and hospitality.

We'll be having meetings with students and staff on this upcoming event. So stay tuned for the planning meeting.
