The UTTC "Roving Reporters" have sent the UTTC Newsletter the following news report on the NIEA Conference held in Bismarck from October 27-31:

The National Indian Education Association Conference was recently held in Bismarck. Indian teachers, administrators in education, counselors, and leaders from tribal, state, and national organizations attended from all over the United States. A total of 72 registered tribes participated in the Conference, and tribal leaders from as far away as Alaska came to Bismarck.

The theme of this year's Conference was "Strength of the People--Enriching the Circle".

Although the Roving Reporters attended only two of the Conference events, we heard from many of our peers that the whole Conference was a huge success.

As part of the NIEA Conference, Anne Sward, the star of the popular daytime soap opera "As the World Turns" arrived on the UTTC campus. United Tribes students and staff had the opportunity to meet the star and visit with her at the school cafeteria. Those who attended enjoyed coffee and cookies with Ms. Sward. The refreshments were compliments of the Food Services students. Ms. Sward explained that she is the Chairperson for a fundraising drive that is currently going on for a scholarship program; the scholarship is for any students in any Indian college. She also described a "logo contest" associated with the fund drive. Any Indian artist is invited to participate. The drawing for the winner and runners-up will be in New York City.

The students who attended the reception for Ms. Sward asked about the soap opera and the scholarship that will be awarded. Ms. Sward stated that people in the east still think that Indians hunt buffalo and live in teepees! She confessed that one of the reasons that she visited here was to see for herself if this is true!

Ms. Sward signed autographs and had pictures taken with various students. She was presented with a very beautiful shawl, compliments of the UTTC Student Senate.

The UTTC Roving Reporters attended the NIEA Pow Wow, which was held at the Bismarck Civic Center. A total of eight drum groups registered; the three singing drum groups that took home all the money were all from Ft. Berthold. First Prize were to the Oakdale Singers from Mandaree; Oakdale beat the Mandaree Singers only two points. The Mandaree Singers won Second Place, and Third Prize went to the Eagle Whistle Singers from Mandaree.
