Al is from a farm south of Dickinson, he always wanted to farm, but due to lack of money he couldn't, so at 21 years of age he went into the service, this was in 1956, where he started his cooking career. Al also went to school to be an electrician, he also worked as a sheet metal worker. He says he has never enjoyed any of this as much as cooking.


In 1958-1964, he worked in Hettinger, 1964-66 Congress Inn in Dickinson, 1966-68 Job Corp here at the Tribes, same kitchen, and the head cook at that time was Al Eckroth, now

our plumber here at UTTC. Than back to Dickinson for 6 months, to Eugene, Oregon worked at T-Bird Cafe, and at the end of 1969, he returned to United Tribes. Since then he has cooked for many Pow Wow's, in those days United Tribes had two Pow wow's, one in June and also September. Al says he can remember dishing and cooking up a meal for 10,000 people.

He also cooked for 8 prison Pow wow's at the same time, as the United Tribes Pow wow. Al Eckroch, remembers those times at the Tribes, when people sat on benches, there were no bleachers at that time, as Swede would say, this was spring of three and fall of twelve. Al also is a musician, where he plays the accordion with a band called Dakota Country. He spent some of his off time as a meal cutter also cooks for the V.F.W. once a year on Veteran's Day. Al and his wife Connie have three sons, Rodney, Gary and Bradley, Rodney works for an underground Cable Co., Gary goes to college in Grand Forks and Bradley goes to Mary College, wife Connie works at J.C. Penny's Co. His parents still reside in Dickinson. Al has been supervisor here at UTTC cafeteria for ten years, and worked for nineteen. So I'd like to say again, "Thank You" Al.
