






are supposed to fly. Years passed, and the eagle grew old. Than one day, he saw a magnificent bird far above him

And now a word about the telephone system at UTTC: when someone calls INTO Tribes, their call is now answered by a recording. The recording answers whether it is during class and office hours during the daytime.....or in the evening when there are few staff working on Campus. If the person calling Tribes is using a PUSH-BUTTON PHONE, the recording can be interrupted at any time by punching the number of the extension desired. If the caller doesn't know the extension number, s/he can wait until the recording stopsspeaking, and the UTTC Operator will come onto the line to dial the extension needed. The recording cannot be interrupted from a dial phone. If the caller is calling from a DIAL PHONE, the recording must be allowed to finish speaking and then the UTTC Operator comes onto the line to dial the needed number.
