SMOKE SIGNALS FROM RECREATION AND ATHLETIC DEPARTMENTS OF U.T.T.C.

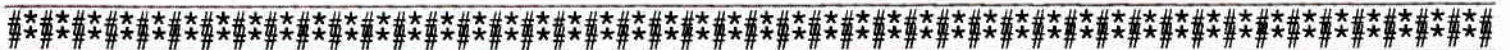
