
THE UTTO NEWSLETTER CELEBRATES NATIVE AMERICAN WEEK AT UTTO WITH THESE WORDS OF HEHAKA SAPA, BLACK ELK:

"You have noticed that everything an Indian does is in a circle, and that is because the Power of the World always works in circles, and everything tries to be round.

In the old days when we were a strong and happy people, all our power came to us from the Sacred Hoop of the Nation and so long as the Hoop was unbroken the people flourished. The flowering tree was the living center of the Hoop, and the circle of the four quarters nourished it. The East gave peace and light, the South game warmth, the West gave rain, and the North with its cold and mighty wind gave strength and endurance.

This knowledge came to us from the outer world with our religion. Everything the Power of the World does is done in a circle. The Sky is round and I have heard that the earth is round like a ball and so are all the stars. The Wind, in its greatest power, whirls. Birds make their nests in circles, for theirs is the same religion as ours. The Sun comes forth and goes down again in a circle. The Moon does the same, and both are round.

Even the seasons form a great circle in their changing, and always come back again to where they were. The life of a man is a circle from childhood to childhood, and so it is in everything where power moves. Our tipis were round like the nests of birds and these were always set in a circle, the Nation's Hoop, a nest of many nests where the Great Spirit meant for us to hatch our children."

At the end of March, the United Tribes Technical College Men's Basketball Team (the THUNDERBIRDS) won the championship at the National American Indian Higher Education Consortium (AIHEC) at the Northern Montana College, Havre, Montana. The THUNDERBIRDS won the men's title by beating Little Big Horn College of the Crow Agency, Montana; the score was 162-114.

The AIHEC Tournament featured both men's and women's basketball. UTTC's Women's Basketball Team also played at the Tourney. CARMEN TWO BEARS was named from the UTTC

Women's Team to the All-Tournament Team. The UTTC Women went 0-2.

Before the Championship game, UTTC defeated Standing Rock College, Ft. Yates, North Dakota in a score of 119-100 in the first round of the 10-team Tournament. The UTTC Men beat Stone Child College of Rocky Boy, Montana, 146-100 in the semifinals. The THUNDERBIRDS were 3-0 in the AIHEC Tournament.

Leading scorers for UTTC in the title game were: MYRON CHAVEZ with 33 points, DALE HALL with 31 points, WES BROWN with 29, VERNON SMITH with 20, DON TWO BEARS with 17, DENNIS FOUR BEARS with 16, RAY MOORE with 16, and RICHARD CHRISTIAN with 10.

CONGRATULATIONS are also in order to the UTTC students who have been going to Bismarck State College to take their GED tests. Anne Kuyper and Mary Lemcke are happy to report that the students they are accompanying to BSC are passing test after test with flying colors!
