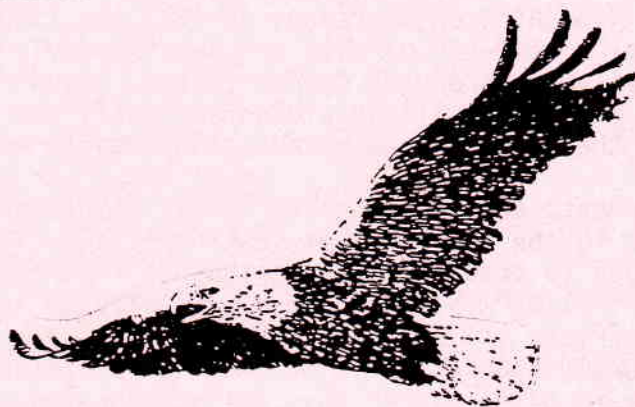
GRADUATES!

UTTC STUDENTS INVITED TO
PRIVATE SHOWING OF "POW WOW HIGHWAY"

Bismarck's MIDCO Theater Company, located at Kirkwood Plaza and other locations in Bismarck has invited the students and staff of UTTC to a private showing of the movie "POWWOW HIGHWAY", on Thursday, April 27th, 1989. The movie will be shown at Kirkwood's Plaza III. Students of UTTC can see the movie at this private showing FREE OF CHARGE! Staff will be charged \$2.00 per ticket. Student Activities (Recreation) will be paying for ALL of UTTC's college students. Staff who will be going to the showing are requested to have the exact change because the manager who will be at the theater will be working alone.

Students are asked to "car-pool" with each other; there will be a bus transporting students to the showing, but seating will be limited on the bus. Students owning cars are encouraged to transport other students to the theater. The bus will leave the UTTC campus at 1:10 PM SHARP! The bus will leave from the UTTC Bus Stop. The movie will start at Plaza III at 1:30 PM SHARP!

"POWWOW HIGHWAY" will be showing in Bismarck this week to the general public. UTTC is lucky to be receiving this private showing of the movie, so all students and staff able to leave the campus for a couple hours are encouraged to go to this movie. 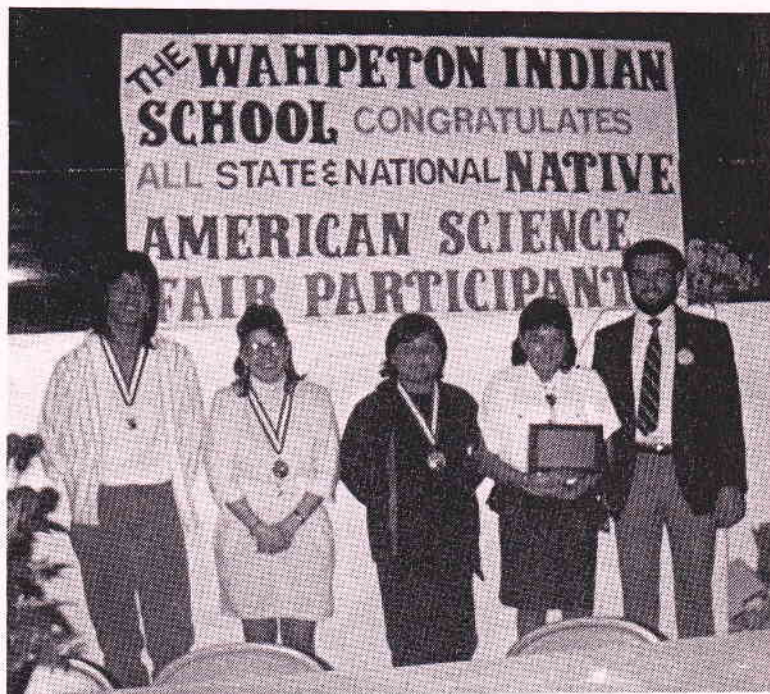

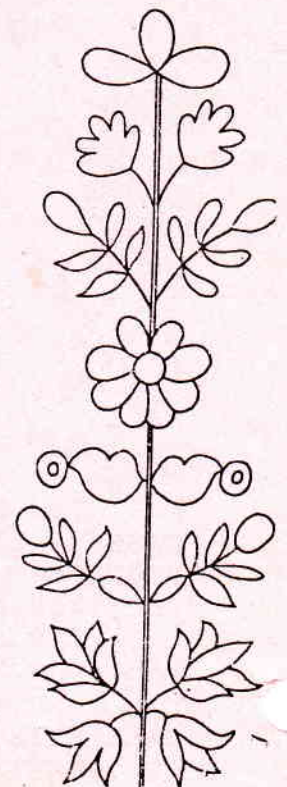
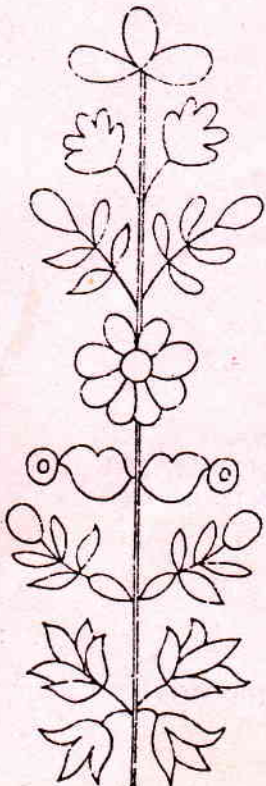
