HERE ARE SOME CURRENT FACTS: 1. One out of 4 American girls are sexually abused before the age of 13; one in 8 boys are sexually abused before the age of 18. 2. 25% of the victims of sexual abuse are under the age of 8. 3. One half of the adolescents who have been abused are 6 or younger. 4. In 85% of the times sexual abuse occurs, the child knows the abuser.

TOGETHER, parents and teachers can change these statistics by teaching basic human rights to children.


DID YOU KNOW that Mickey just had a birthday!? (And, no, we're not telling how old

she is.....or how YOUNG she is, we should say!)


DID YOU KNOW that the ONLY bad thing that any of Mickey's friends say about her is that she smokes? (Better quit, Mickey! We like you healthy!)
