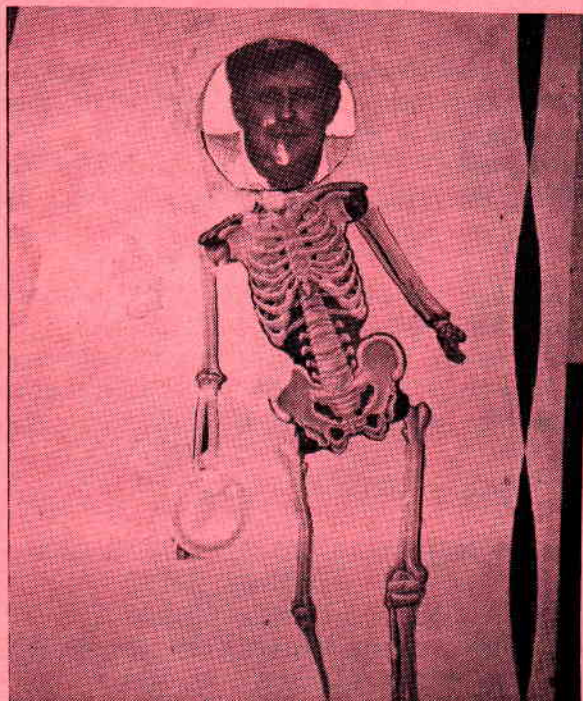

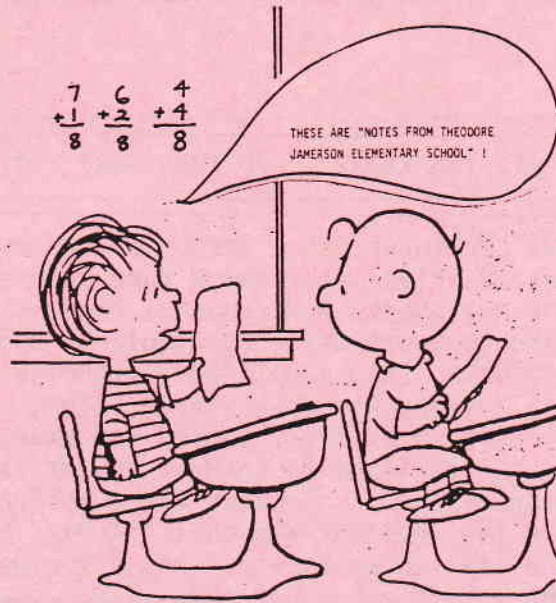

The Theodore Jamerson RIF (Reading is Fundamental) Project was awarded one of forty New York Life Foundation grants to local RIF Projects for outstanding service in motivating youngsters to read.

The grant awarded to TJ is in the amount of \$250.00; it will be used to purchase additional books for our children. CHRISTY RED BIRD, MELANIE STANDING BEAR, URSULA RED BIRD, and ARLIS LITTLE WIND were elected by their classmates to go with Mrs. Frey, Reading Teacher, and Mrs. Mueller, Chapter I Coordinator, on a book-buying trip to Saks News Agency in Bismarck. The students will be responsible for selecting two books for each student in their class. All books selected will be displayed during National Book Week, and the students at TJ will choose their two books from the display.

Each student at Theodore Jamerson also participates in four RIF distributions throughout the year. The first one was held in October 1989; the second is scheduled for December 1989, the third in February 1990, and the last one in April 1990. Some of these funds are matching federal money along with money raised locally. It is our hope at TJ to include the Preschool children in the December or February distributions. A committee of five will be selected to decide who will review book catalogs and order the books for these distributions.
