This week, the NEWSLETTER is featuring PHIL BAIRD, the Director of the Northern Plains Resource and Evaluation Center on the campus of the United Tribes Technical College.

An enrolled member of South Dakota's Rosebud Sioux Tribe, Phil has been employed with the Northern Plains Resource and Evaluation Center II since January, 1986. He served initially as a consultant and an Education Specialist before becoming the permanent REC II Director in 1987.

For the past 15 years, Phil has acquired professional experiences in Indian education, youth leadership programs, and Tribal natural resources. He is a former Vice President of Sinte Gleska College at Rosebud, South Dakota. He also spent nearly 10 years with the South Dakota Indian Education Board of Directors and administered a state Indian youth leadership program in South Dakota for 5 years.

Phil earned his Bachelors Degree from South Dakota State University. In 1985, he received his Masters Degree in agricultural education from Iowa State University. He was also involved with extended college internships on the Lower Brule Sioux Reservation and with the BIA Central Office of Indian Education in Washington, D.C.

Phil's primary personal interests include rodeo and independent basketball competition. He has served the past two years at UTTC's home game basketball announcer.

On November 22, 1989, Phil Baird was the Guest Speaker at Graduation Ceremonies honoring the Fall, 1989 Graduating Class of United Tribes Technical College.

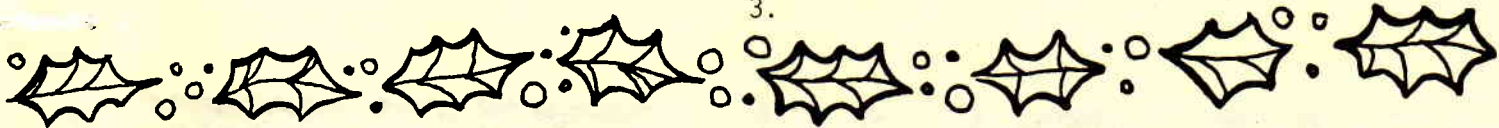

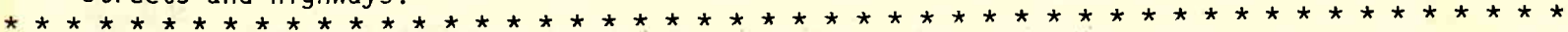
