

David Gipp receives honorary doctorate

David Gipp, Bismarck, is one of 10 persons who will be awarded honorary doctorates at North Dakota State University's Centennial Commencement on May 26.

Since 1970 when, at the age of 24, he was the only Native American elected as a delegate to the N.D. Constitutional Convention, Gipp has been a leader in the advancement of Native American education regionally and nationally. He was one of the founders and first executive director of the American Indian Higher Education Consortium from 1973 to 1977. He has been president of the United Tribes Technical College in Bismarck since 1977. He guided UTTC to gaining North Central accreditation in 1982 and to technical degree status in 1987.


