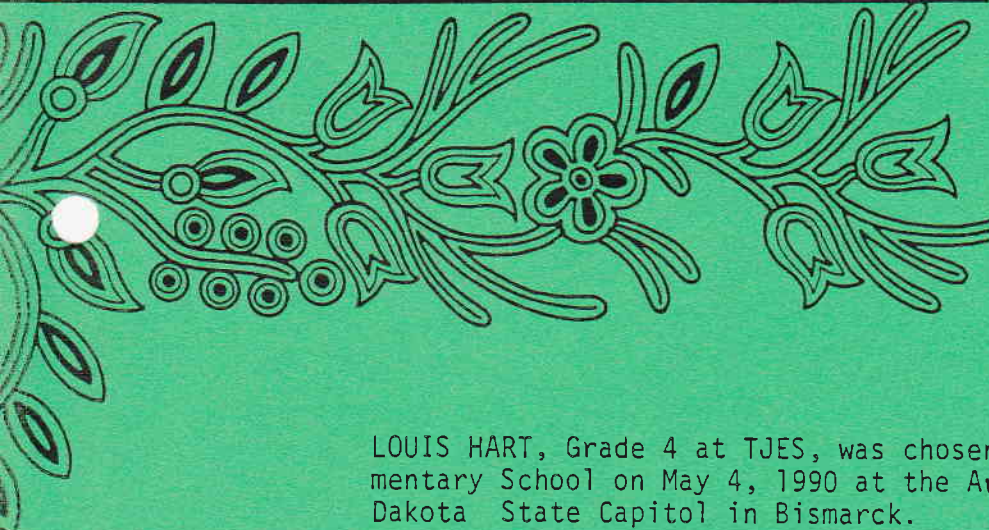

Learn Traditional Arts of North Dakota Native Americans

Workshops offered Saturdays, May 5, June 2, July 7 and August 4, 9:00 to 4:00 p.m. at the North Dakota Heritage Center, will illustrate the traditional arts of North Dakota Native Americans. Traditional gardening, basketry, and beadwork will be demonstrated and taught with appropriate historical background and examples illustrated by Heritage Center museum exhibits.



Mandan/Hidatsa/Arikara Traditional Gardening

May 5 (Saturday)

Bob Sage-Chase and Lydia Sage-Chase, of Mandan descent, will teach traditional Native American gardening on May 5, from 9:00 to 4:00 p.m. Participants will learn about the history and traditions of early horticulture in North Dakota, and experiment with planting a traditional garden on the Heritage Center grounds. A highlight of the workshop will be assembling traditional Mandan garden tools.

Ojibway Basketry

June 2 (Saturday)

Ojibway basketry will be taught by Rose and Francis Cree on June 2, from 9:00 to 4:00 p.m. They will share their traditional knowledge and skills, and teach participants to create their own baskets. The cost for the workshop is \$7.50.

Mandan/Hidatsa/Arikara Burden Baskets

July 7 (Saturday)

Erik Holland and Gloria Wilkinson will teach participants how to make burden baskets on July 7, from 9:00 to 4:00 p.m. Burden baskets were carried on the back and used by women to harvest corn from the gardens in fields near earth lodge villages. The cost for the workshop is \$7.50.

Sioux Beadwork

August 4 (Saturday)

Sioux beadwork will be taught by D. Joyce Kitson on August 4, from 9:00 to 4:00 p.m. She will discuss symbol and design and get participants involved in developing their own beadwork skills. The cost for the workshop is \$7.50.
