Gipp and Grosz honored by NDSU

David Gipp, Bismarck, a leader in American Indian higher education; and pharmacist William Grosz, Wahpeton, secretary-treas-urer of the North Dakota State Board of Pharmacy at Bismarck, are two of 10 people who will be accorded honorary doctorates at North Dakota State University's Centennial Commencement on Saturday.

Gipp, one of the founders and first executive director of the American Indian Higher Education Consortium, has been president of United Tribes Technical College in Bismarck since 1977. He has guided UTTC to gaining North Central acredditaion in 1982 and to technical degree status in 1987.

Grosz was the owner and pharmacist-in-charge of the Wahpeton Drug Company from 1952-81. Throughout that 31-career and since then, he has distinguished himself through his commitment to public health. He has earned the abiding respect of fellow professionals, who have frequently honored him for outstanding service to the pharmacy profession. He also has been an instructor at the






