





The program receives additional Federal monies for free and reduced price meals or free milk for children from families whose income is at or below the levels shown above.

A letter and application form are being distributed to the parents of enrolled children. Additional copies are available at the office in each facility. The information provided on the application is confidential and will be used only for the purpose of determining eligibility. Applications may be submitted at any time during the year. Applications submitted by food stamp or AFDC assistance units must contain names of children, AFDC or food stamp case numbers and the signature of an adult household member. Other households must provide the names of all household members, the social security number of the primary wage earner or the household member who signs the form, the amount and source of income received by each household member and the signature of an adult household member.

If, after submission of an application, there are changes in the family size or the household income that result in an increase of more than \$50 per month (\$600 per year), the food authority should be contacted. AFDC or food stamp households must notify the food authority when no longer receiving these benefits. If you are not eligible now, but have a decrease in household income, become unemployed, have an increase in family size or begin to receive food stamps or AFDC, fill out an application at that time. Such changes may affect the eligibility status of the family.

*Sponsors of day care homes are required to submit only the first paragraph of this press release to the news media.
