 Children must be in school each day unless they are sick, in which case they should go to the Student Health Clinic. There are staff that can assist you in caring for your sick children, daily 8:00 to 4:00.

- 3. Should a child miss more than 20 days, they will be retained in their grade (per state law).
- 4. Charges will be filed with Burleigh County Social Services for investigation if there is reason to believe that there is Child Abuse or Neglect.
- 5. Curfew for all elementary students is 9:00pm. If Security sees children in UTTC Buildings or on the playgrounds without adult supervision, they will be sent or taken home. Children must be supervised at all times.
- Guidelines for baby sitting on UTTC Campus are as follows: The latest a baby sitter (under 18) should be in charge is 12:00 midnight (Fri& Sat) and 10:00pm on all other school nights.
