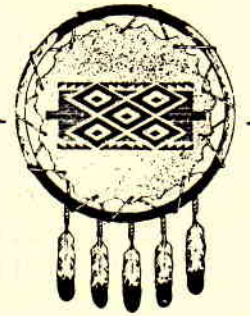

Aaron J. Hamilton, Jr.

April 13, 1967 – December 14, 1990

AARON J. HAMILTON, JR., age 23, died December 11, 1990 in Med-Center I in Bismarck, North Dakota, after being struck by a vehicle.

He was born April 13, 1967, in Poplar, Montana, a son of Aaron and Karen Hamilton. He attended schools in Brockton, Poplar, and Pasco, Washington, then graduated from Dickinson High School in North Dakota in 1986. He worked for the Job Corps in Rapid City, South Dakota, and in Anaconda, Montana for A & S Industries. He also worked as a firefighter.

Aaron also attended Fordham University in the Bronx, New York City, and Fort Peck Community College in Montana. At the time of his death, he was attending United Tribes Technical College in Bismarck, North Dakota.

Survivors include his wife, Andrea of Poplar, Montana; two sons, Loren and Brandon, and two daughters, Lori and Aaree Lee, all of the family home; his mother, Karen Hamilton of Poplar; a brother, Anthony D. Hamilton, of Poplar; three sisters, Nanette Hamilton, Thomasine Hamilton, and Deanna First, all of Poplar; grandparents, Violet Hamilton, Donna Chase, Gwen Mail, Harvey Hamilton, and Harold Hamilton, all of Poplar, Susan Redboy of Fort Kipp, and Isadore Johnson, of Yakima, Washington; and a nephew, Anthony A. Mazawasicuna.

Aaron enjoyed fishing, drawing, playing the guitar, and writing songs, some of which were used in Nashville, Tennessee.

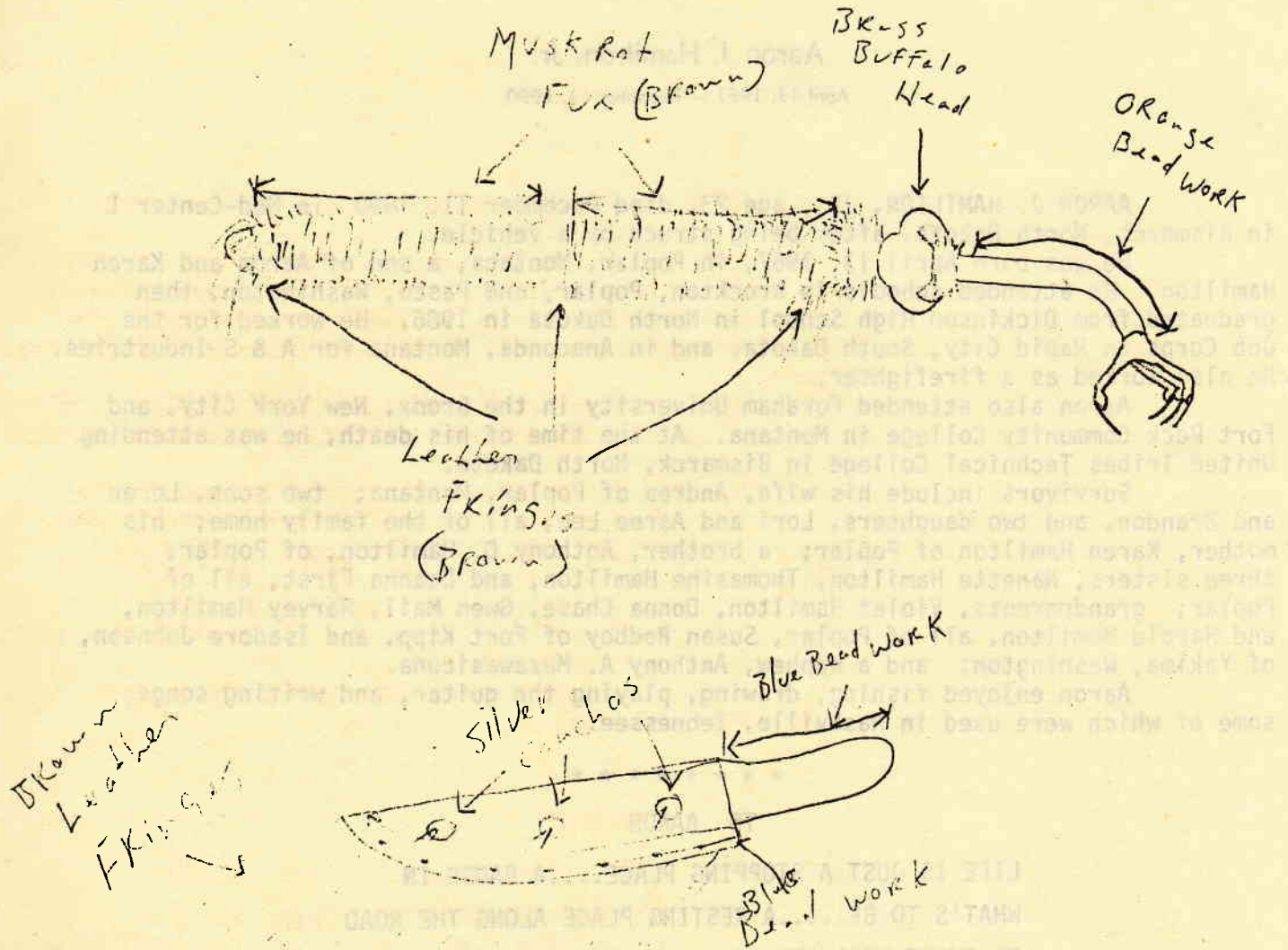
