ON APRIL 10th and 11th, 1991, THE ADMINISTRATION, FACULTY, STAFF, AND STUDENTS WERE HONORED TO MEET MR. BURKHARD KOCK, A TEACHER, PRINCIPAL, AND TEACHER-TRAINER FROM WEST GERMANY.

At the April 10, 1991 Faculty Meeting, Mr. John Kaufman introduced HERR BURKHARD KOCK to Mr. David Gipp, Mr. Ed Johnson, and to the teachers and staff attending the meeting.

Mr. Kock is a principal, teacher, teacher-trainer, and member of the selection board for the Chamber of Commerce in Flensburg, Germany. Flensburg is a 700-year-old town close to the border between Germany and Denmark. The German educator is one of sixteen educators from East and West Germany (now unified Germany) who are on a seven-week tour of schools in the United States. Mr. Kock was the only one of his group who travelled to North Dakota. He was in North Dakota for two weeks; before he arrived in North Dakota, he was in Washington D.C. and St. Louis.

After leaving our state, he will be in Bloomington, Indiana, attending a conference on American studies, particularly in the subjects of drama, art, history, etc.

The German educators are visiting the U.S., funded by the German Marshall Fund, a foundation funded by the Germans as a gift to the American people for the help received

by Germany following World War II.

After Mr. Kock addressed the Faculty of UTTC, he was a guest for lunch at the school cafeteria. The following day, he returned to take a tour of the campus and to meet with Mr. Gipp. He told Mary Lemcke, who was his guide, that he particularly wanted to visit personally with the college students attend UTTC. Mr. Kock's special interest is in Native American languages and Indian art. While he toured the Skills Center, he asked students he spoke with to speak their tribal languages so he could record them speaking. He also took pictures of the students. While he visited the Administration Building, he showed great appreciation for the Indian art displayed in the Executive Meeting Room, and while he toured the Skills Center, he lingered in the Exhibit Area, studying the copies of the paintings by Remington and Russell on display there.

Mr. Kock expressed special appreciation for the courtesy and kindness he felt he received from UTTC staff and students, and he said he'd like to come back to the college when he has more time to spend visiting with more people. His schedule had been prepared before he arrived at UTTC, and he said he'd felt he'd had too little time to

do all he wanted to at the college.

Mr. Kock's daughter attended a university in Seattle, Washington for a year. He visited her during that time, and took a long trip up and down the western coast of the United States. During that time, he had had the opportunity to see the art work of Indian tribes along the coast, and he enthusiastically described many of the beautiful pieces of wood carving that tribes in the Northwestern U.S. do.

We would like to thank Burkhard for coming to UTTC to visit us, and we invite

him to come back again SOON, when he can stay longer!


