U.T.T.C. STUDENTS PARTICIPATE IN V.I.C.A. COMPETITION

On March 25 and 26, 1991, the North Dakota State V.I.C.A. (Vocational Industrial Clubs of America) Competition was held in Bismarck, North Dakota at Bismarck State College, Med Center One, United Tribes Technical College, and the Radisson Inn.

The general session was held at Bismarck State College Auditorium, with the President of Bismarck State College, Dr. Kermit Lidstrom, welcoming the V.I.C.A. participants to the State Competition. Approximately 300 to 500 students and faculty from around the state were represented; students came from both secondary and post-secondary schools.

The Skilled Competition began Monday afternoon, with various sites such as Bismarck State College Vocational Building, Med Center One, United Tribes Technical College Skills Center, and Mandan Sr. High being used by the various groups. The competitors in PLUMBING, CARPENTRY, COMPUTER DRAFTING, NURSES ASSISTANCE, AUTO-TECHNOLOGY, MOTORCYCLE REPAIR, SMALL NGINES, RESIDENTIAL WIRING etc. met in these areas and went "head-to-head" against each other.

On Tuesday, March 26th, the competition was in Leadership Skills. These were held at the Radisson Inn. Students competed in leadership areas such as PREPARED SPEECH, EXTEMPO-RANEOUS SPEECH, JOB SKILLED DEMONSTRATION, JOB INTERVIEW, and OPENING AND CLOSING CEREMONY. Dinner was held at the Radisson Inn on Tuesday evening. After dinner, election of the new officers for the 1991-92 school year and awards ceremonies were held.

UNITED TRIBES has THREE STUDENTS from the AUTOMOTIVE TECHNOLOGY PROGRAM who competed at the V.I.C.A. annual competition. These students were RICH RAYGO and ROBERT HLAVINKA, who competed in the AUTOMOTIVE SKILLED division, and EMERSON MELBOURNE, who competed in JOB SKILLED DEMONSTRATION. EMERSON PLACED SECOND IN THIS COMPETITION!

UNITED TRIBES TECHNICAL COLLEGE received a plaque from the State for forming a V.I.C.A. Chapter; the college also received a certificate of participation for the V.I.C.A. Conference activities.
