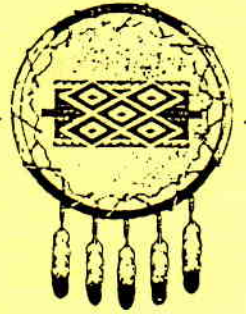

Walking In Two Worlds: Native American Spirituality is the theme for the Great Plains Institute of Theology Spring Symposium. It will meet May 6 & 7 at United Tribes Technical College in Bismarck.

Featured presenters are Martin Broken Leg, PhD, Lakota Sioux, Professor of Native American Studies at Augustana College, Sioux Falls SD, recent author of Reclaiming Youth At Risk, and an Episcopal priest on the staff of Calvary Cathedral; and Diane Glancy, Cherokee, assistant professor of English at Macalester in St. Paul, author of poems and stories including Brown Wolf Leaves the Reservation, Iron Woman, Trigger Dance, 1990 winner of the Capricorn poetry prize and the Nilon Fiction award.

Martin Broken Leg will focus on "Native American Religious Inheritance" and Diane Glancy on "Combining Native American and Biblical Tradition".

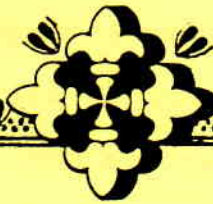

The UTTC STAFF/STUDENT NEWSLETTER likes to present articles about the different areas at the United Tribes Technical College and Theodore Jamerson Elementary School; there are many areas on campus that are vital to the continuance of daily "business as usual" and staff members who keep those areas going.

This week's NEWSLETTER will be featuring the SUPPLY AREA AT UTTC, and the three staff members who work here will be featured in this and the two NEWSLETTERS to come.

WHO? Listed alphabetically, the three people who keep SUPPLY going are:

MILO CHASE, ED KNIFE, and VERNA KOCH

WHAT? "Property and Supply" maintains the Post Office on campus, picking up mail and distributing it into the Staff and Student mailboxes on campus -- they take mail into town that is outgoing from the campus. They also sell postage and circulate memos, information, the NEWSLETTER, materials, etc. from area to area on the campus itself. When teachers, administrators, staff, etc. order materials needed for their work, they send those orders through "Property and Supply" so that they can be filled either on campus or from office suppliers, book sellers, etc. from off-campus.

Supply staff do inventory, and they also research prices in town on available merchandise, so other campus staff gets the best quality merchandise for the best prices. Stock for campus classrooms and offices are up-dated. Specifically, MILO does equipment inventory on campus of equipment purchased through UTTC and BIA funds.

WHERE? Supply and the UTTC Post Office are located downstairs of the Sitting Bull Men's Dorm.

WHEN? Supply and the Post Office are open weekdays and can be reached at EXT. 250.

WHY? The purpose of Supply is to move books, equipment, and other supplies to the staff needing them on campus.

VERNA KOCH, the "Lady in Supply" used to be a student at United Tribes in 1973 -- she was in the Business Clerical Vocation. She became an employee of UTTC in 1976. When she was first employed, she worked at the Cultural Center; she then worked with Ed Knife in Supply, and did a three-year stint at Administration too, before returning to Supply.
