Humanities group hosts talks on book, film series

Brian Palecek leads off a North Dakota Humanities Council discussion and film series Sunday with a program about books and readers, "To Read Or Not To Read" at 2 p.m. at the Bismarck Public Library.

The series of book discussions and the most memorable movies of 1940 will continue Sunday afternoons at One World Coffee House starting Oct. 13. The 2 p.m. discussions are scheduled through Nov. 24.

University of North Dakota historian D. Jerome Tweton will conclude the series Dec. 1 at the library with an overview of the

"movies of the year" before the United States entered World War II.

Films shown at One World Coffee House begin Oct. 13 with Charlie Chaplin's "The Great Dictator," followed by "Native Son" on Oct. 27, and the 1940 film "The Grapes of Wrath," Nov. 10.

Books are Richard Wright's indictment of treatment of African -Americans in "Native Son" (Oct. 20); Hemingway's "For Whom the Bell Tolls" (Nov. 3); Faulkner's first book of the Snopes family, "The Hamlet" (Nov 17); and Carson McCullers' "The Heart is a Lonely Hunter" (Nov. 24).


Palecek said reading the books before discussions is "most useful, but not necessary." The books will be available in paperback at low cost at the coffee house and library.





NEWS FROM PLACEMENT-

A glance at the 27 occupations predicted by the Bureau of Labor Statistics to have the largest growth in the next six years reveals that about three-fourths are jobs that require vocational skills.

Most of the new jobs will come from industries that provide services, especially in health care and food services. In general, jobs for workers with at least some postsecondary education and mastery of special skills will grow much faster than jobs of unskilled workers.

Employers are looking for employees with skills that can put them right to work in their business. They are also looking for employees that are dependable and cooperative.

While you are attending UTTC now, you are receiving hands-on experience in the many growing career areas such as health occupations, computor operations, electronics, food preperation, mechanics and many others.

Remember that listing vocational education experience on your job resume is a plus with employees!

NOTE- My grandfather once told me that there are two kinds of people: those who do the work and those who take the credit. He told me to try to be in the first group; there was less competition there.
