UTTC STUDENTS DO WELL AT 1992 VICA COMPETITION

On March 16 and 17, 1992, the North Dakota State VICA (Vocational Industrial Clubs of America) Skilled and Leadership Competition was held in Bismarck at Bismarck State College, MedCenter One, United Tribes Technical College, and the Holiday Inn.

The general session was held at the Bismarck State College Auditorium, with the President of Bismarck State College, Kermit Lidstrom, welcoming the VICA members. Approximately 400-500 students and faculty from around the state, both secondary and post-secondary, were represented.

The Skilled Competition began Monday afternoon with various sites such as Bismarck State College Vocational Building, MedCenter One, United Tribes Technical College Skills Center, and Mandan Senior High School. The competition was in plumbing, carpentry, computer drafting, nurses' assistance, automotive technology, motorcycle repair, small engines, residential wiring, just to name a few areas.

On Tuesday, Leadership Skills were held at the Holiday Inn. Students competed in Leadership Skills, such as Prepared Speech, Extemporaneous Speech, Job Skilled Demonstration, Job Interviews, and Opening/Closing ceremonies.

On Tuesday, dinner was held at the Holiday Inn, with election of officers for the 1992-93 school year. After dinner, awards were given out.

United Tribes Technical College had four students competing in Skills and Leadership Skills. They were: ROBERT HLAVINKA, EMERSON PLENTY CHIEF, and STEVE WAUPEKENAY, who competed in Skills in Automotive Technology; and MAX SERAWOP, who competed in Skills in Carpentry.

In Leadership Skills, MAX SERAWOP competed in Extemporaneous Speech. Max received an honorable mention for his speech. Also, Max placed SECOND in the written test for carpentry.

United Tribes Technical College received a plaque from the State for Supporting and Participating in the 19th Annual VICA Skilled and Leadership Contest.

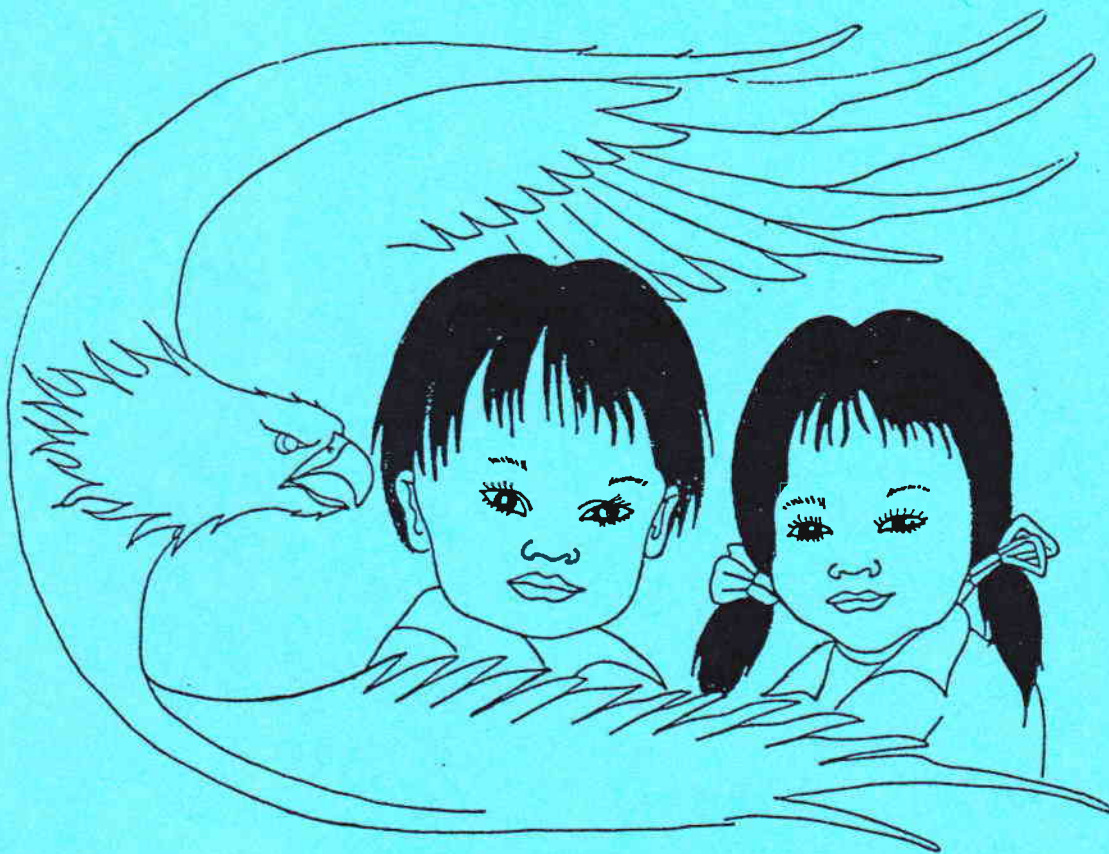
