Items to be considered for publication must be received on or before the third Monday of each month. Items which are received later than the stated deadline will be considered for publication in the next month's issue.


Items published in KEYAPI do not necessarily express the views of the paper staff or advisors. The staff has the right to accept or reject any articles presented for publication.







Rewritten by Grades 7 and 8


