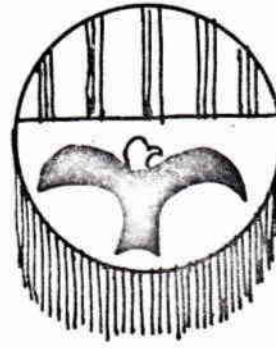

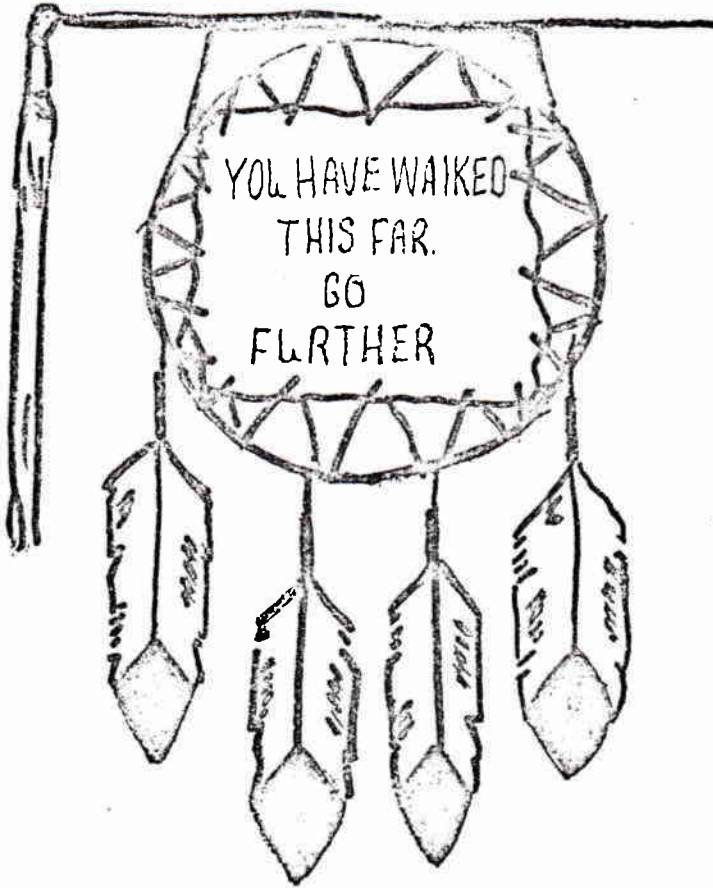

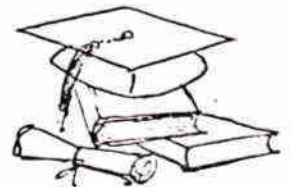

Zona Thunder Hawk has ably demonstrated and passed on her skill in making fry bread. Even some of the non-Indian staff have succeeded in making edible fry bread. She has consented to share her recipe to our readers. TRY IT -- YOU WILL LIKE IT.

Fry Bread

4 cups flour
 2 Tablespoons baking powder
 ¼ Teaspoon salt

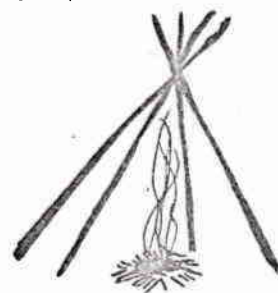
Mix above dry ingredients and make a well. Pour in 2 cups warm water and 1½ Tablespoons syrup.

Mix and roll on floured board. Knead and roll out about ½ to 1 inch deep at 400°.

Zona uses Crisco.

Brown both sides, place bread on paper towling.

Delicious to eat warm with syrup.

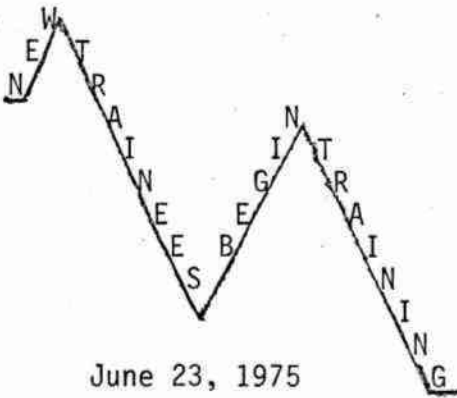

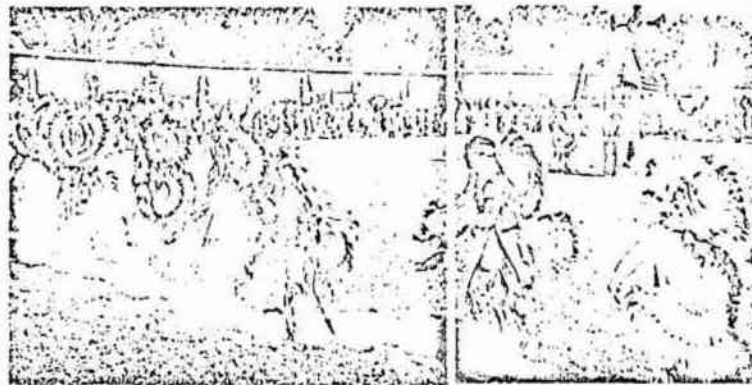
