stamped, self-addressed envelope.



I would like to thank the people who helped make this month possible:



Fry Bread

4 cups flour

2 Tablespoons baking powder

与 Teaspoon salt

Mix above dry ingredients and make a well. Pour in 2 cups warm water and $1\frac{1}{2}$ Tablespoons syrup.

Mix and roll on floured board. Knead and roll out about $\frac{1}{2}$ to 1 inch deep at 400° .

Zona uses Crisco.

Brown both sides, place bread on paper towling.

Delicious to eat warm with syrup.






