## INDIAN CULTURE IS FRY BREAD

During Indian Culture month, Personal Development students are learning to appreciate more fully their proud and beautiful Indian heritage.

Besides developing an interest for Indian Culture, some of the students have concrete evidence of their effort and time Most of the women are making shawls with some of the husbands assisting. Students have also made chokers, bands, belts, hair ties, ect.

Zona Thunder Hawk has ably demonstrated and passed on her skill in making fry bread. Even some of the non-Indian staff hàve succeeded in making edible fry bread. She has consented to share her recipe to our readers. TRY IT -- YOU WILL LIKE IT.

Fry Bread
4 cups flour
2 Tablespoons baking powder
$\frac{1}{4}$ Teaspoon salt
Mix above dry ingredients and make a well. Pour in 2 cups warm water and $1 \frac{1}{2}$ Tablespoons syrup.
Mix and roll on floured board. Knead and roll out about $\frac{1}{2}$ to 1 inch deep at $400^{\circ}$. Zona uses Crisco.
Brown both sides, place bread on paper towling.
Delicious to eat warm with syrup.
