Learn to treat a Bee Sting

Bee not afraid! Chances are you will have a close encounter with a bee a few times in your life. Bee stings can be painful at best, and fatal if you are allergic to them. Even if you are not allergic to bee sting, you can reduce the pain and swelling if you respond correctly with this little trauma.

A bee stinger is one of nature's little wonders: after a bee stings you and deposits the stinger, the stinger continued to pump venom into your bloodstream for up to 20 minutes. Look for the stringer:

- Look for the raised, reddening area on the part of the body that has been stung. If the victim has received multiple stings, first look for areas on the head, neck and torso.
- Once the stinger has been located, look carefully for a small, dark object in the center that looks like a small splinter. This is the stinger.
- Act quickly and simply. Use you thumb and forefinger to grab the sting as close to the skin as possible, and pull straight out. You can also use a tweezers or a flat edge (like a credit card) to scrape the stinger out of the wound.

As about allergies. Four percent of the human population are allergic to bee stings. For these people, a bee sting can be life threatening, and requires prompt medical attention. So your first move is to ask the victim if they are allergic to bee stings.

- If the answer is yes: ask the victim and bystanders if anyone has a bee sting kit (anaphylaxis kit). If a kit is available, follow the directions inside for treatment. If no kit is available, ask a bystander to dial 911. If no bystander is available, find a phone and place the call yourself.
- If the answer is no or I don't know: observe the victim for the following: headache, muscle cramps, fever, drowsiness or unconsciousness, and difficulty breathing or swallowing. If any of these are observed, call 911 and request an ambulance.

Soothe the sting. There is a wide variety of sting remedies, and any person who get stung regularly seems to have a different remedy that they swear by. But the following remedy will certainly ease the pain.

- Wash the sting area, using soap and water if available. If soap and water are not available, use alcohol swabs.
- Apply cold compresses. Try putting ice cubes in a plastic bag or washcloth. If there is no ice available, try using a cloth that has been soaked in cold water.

SCHOLARSHIP ANNOUNCEMENT

Dear North Dakota Educators and American Indian College Students:

I am pleased to announce that for the 1999-2000 academic year the North Dakota Indian Education Association (NDIEA) will be awarding eleven (11) scholarships to promising college students. Please feel free to duplicate the application materials and distribute to American Indian college students. Scholarship eligibility requirements are:

- Four (4) \$200 scholarships will be awarded (one per ND reservation/tribe) to first time college students majoring in any area, who are enrolled members of a North Dakota tribe with at least one fourth (1/4) degree blood quantum, and you must have graduated from high school or completed a General Education Development (GED) degree in North Dakota during the 1998-99 school year.
- Two (2) \$200 and five (5) \$100 scholarships will be awarded to undergraduate, graduate, or professional (law and medical) students majoring in any area, who are enrolled members of a North Dakota tribe with at least one-fourth (1/4) degree blood quantum.

***NOTE - Students Must Submit the Following:**

- Completed Application and Activities Form
- High School Academic Transcript or GED Scores for first time college students, or College Academic Transcript for continuing college students
- Proof of College Enrollment for the 1999-2000 School Year
- Proof of Tribal Enrollment

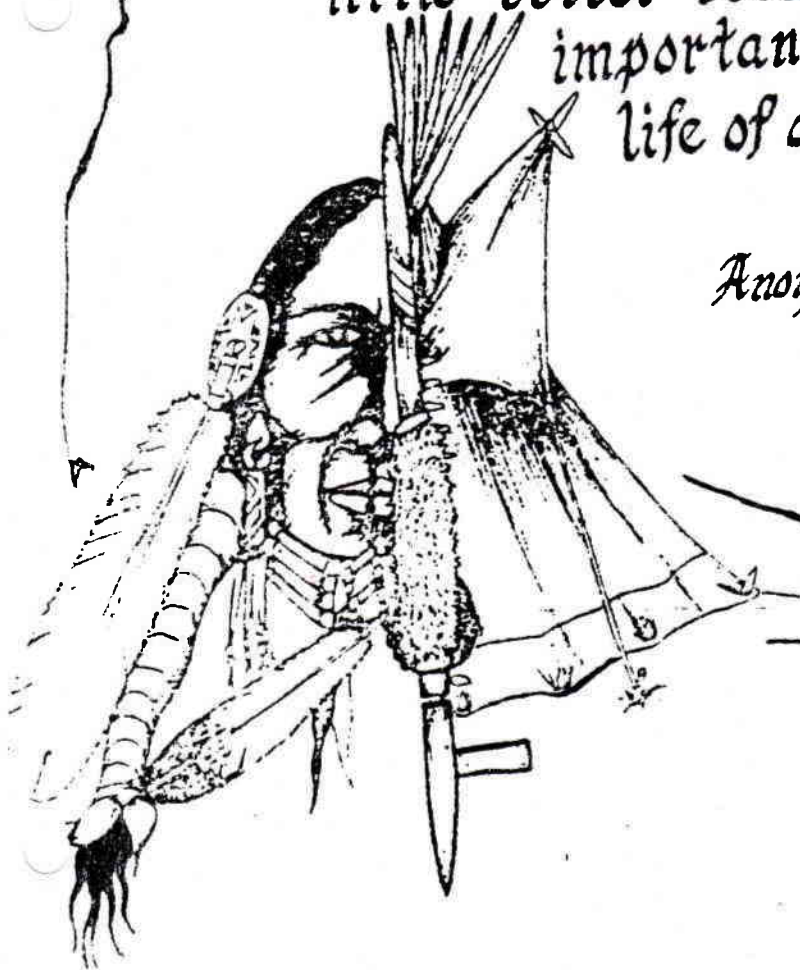
