### **United Tribes Receives Title III Grant**

United Tribes Technical College received official notification from the U.S. Department of Education that our Title III proposal submitted in late May 1999 will be funded. UTTC was recommended for a five-year development grant under the Tribally Controlled Colleges and Universities Program of Title III of the Higher Education Act. The purpose of these grant funds is to strengthen institutions serving Native American students. UTTC will be developing a comprehensive student service program over the next five years. The major activity will be to improve student achievement and increase retention for Native American students attending UTTC. To accomplish this goal UTTC will (a) complete the renovation of the south wing of the James Henry Community Building to serve as the Student Center, (b) focus on unifying efforts of all student service departments, and (c) use the new building to provide increased access to computing for students. The amount of the 1st year award is \$395,000.

A Title III Planning Committee has been formulated to achieve the stated project goals and objectives. Members of the planning committee include Dr. John Derby, Title III Project Director, Bennett Yellow Bird, Russell Swagger, John Beheler, Phil Baird, Royce Irwin, Phyllis Howard, Vern Anderson, and a student delegate to be named by the Student Senate. The planning committee will serve as a review and oversight to the approved budget and make their recommendations to Dr. Dave Gipp, UTTC President before resubmission to the U.S. Department of Education.
