










Enclosed you will find some applications, however students may apply online at <u>www.wiredscholar.com/usafunds</u>. The deadline for applications is *April 16, 2001*. Scholarships will be awarded around June 15.

This year, the program will award \$1.5 million in new scholarships to up to 1,000 undergraduate and graduate students, and renew scholarships awarded in 2000, provided that the recipients meet eligibility requirements.

Recipients will be chosen based on the following criteria:

- > An adjusted family gross income of \$35,000 or less
- Up to 50 percent of the scholarship awards will be targeted to applicants who, in addition to having financial need, are members of ethnic minority or are physically disabled.
- > Past academic performance, leadership and participation in school and community activities and appraisals.
- Applicants from all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and all U.S. territories and commonwealths are eligible to apply, as are eligible U.S. non-citizens. (Special consideration will be given to applicants from states where USA Funds is the designated guarantor of federal education loans.)
